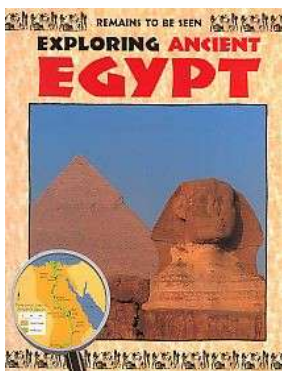
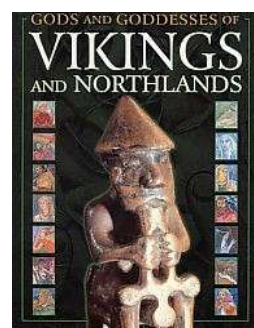
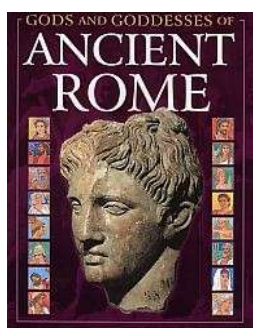
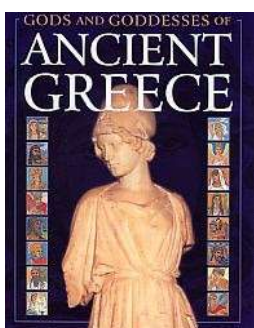
GODS & GODDESSES

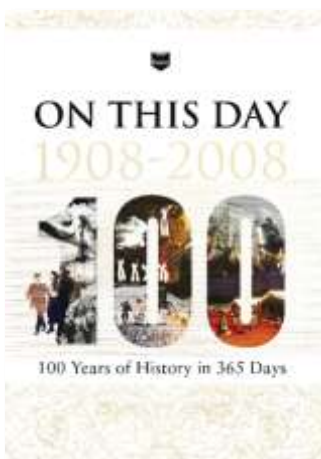
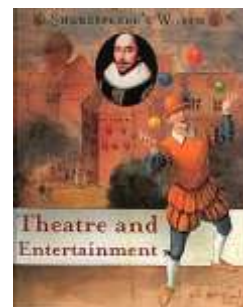
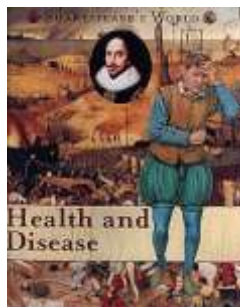
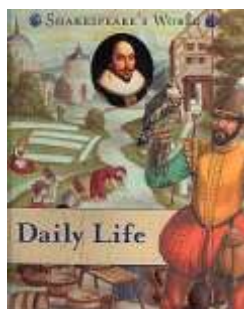




SHAKESPEARE'S WORLD

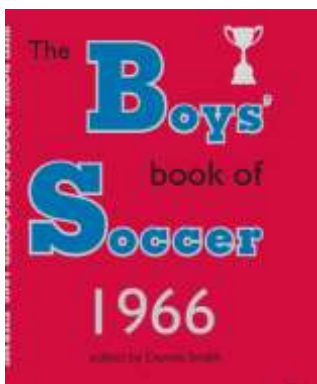
A journey through 100 years in 365 days

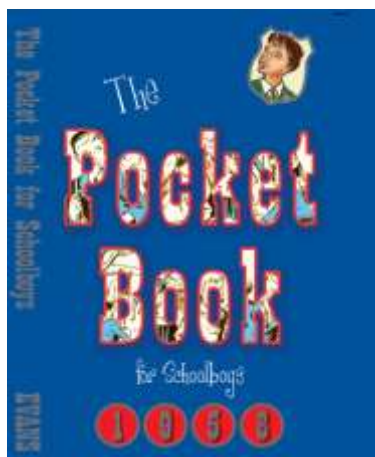


THE BOY'S BOOK OF SOCCER 1966

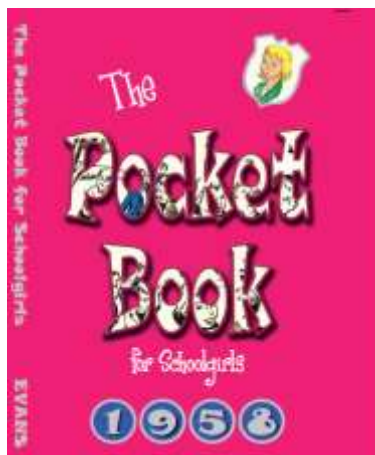

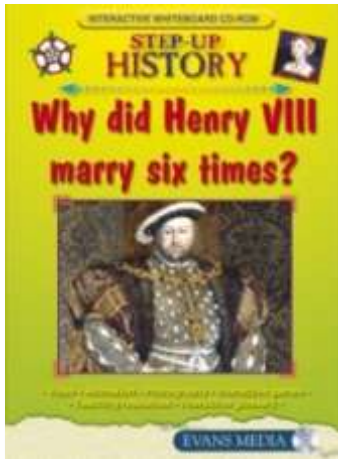
Pocket-sized books with a compendium of facts and figures about the solar system, countries of the world, sporting events and hobbies, mathematical tables, first aid and more.

Boys on the other hand were given a rich miscellany of facts on hobbies, sport, science, ships, nature and 'technical' and recommended reading included 'Teach Yourself to Fly!' Rather than domestic hints, there were morse code, loco numbers, flags, metal-working ...

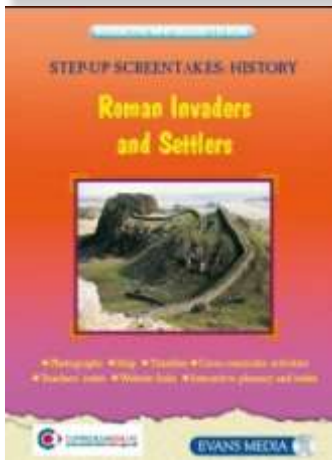




These interactive CD-roms are designed for whole class use with interactive whiteboards. The CDs can also be used by individual pupils or small groups in the classroom or ICT suite.

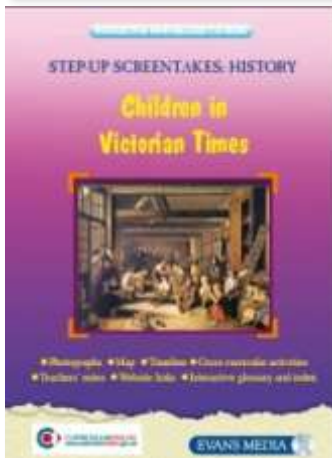
